Revelation 22:12-21

Prayer

Father in heaven, you sent your Son, our Lord Jesus, to bring peace and hope to our fallen world. Already in eternity you planned to overturn the tyranny of Satan and the ravages of sin and you kept your promises to restore the perfection of paradise.

Lead us to cherish your great mercy and hold to it as our priceless treasure.

Lord Jesus, Lamb of God, we praise and adore you for offering your perfect life and innocent death to redeem the world from death and hell. You proclaimed the good news that sins are forgiven and life with God is restored and you called your followers to share the gospel with all people.

Make us bold and confident to be witnesses to family and friends we know and love.

Holy Spirit, Lord, and giver of life, through Word and sacrament you create and strengthen faith that trusts the promise of the Father and the work of his Son. You break down the barriers of resistance and rejection and bring the lost into the family of God.

Empower and encourage us to speak about Jesus to neighbors and acquaintances.

Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.

Silent prayer

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, move us by your great love to enter the mission fields near our homes and neighborhoods. Help us always to be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks us to give the reason for the hope that we have.

Guide us, strengthen us, and bless us as we share the love of Jesus. Amen.

Be seated

Rite of Installation

Those being installed stand before the assembly.

The apostle Paul said: "There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. To each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good."

Dear *brother*(*s*), in Christian freedom and in good order you have been elected and called to serve as [*called position*(*s*)] of our *district/synod*.

You have been called to a ministry of supervision, oversight, counsel, encouragement, and leadership, as defined in the constitution of the synod. You are charged with maintaining and strengthening unity in doctrine and practice and supervising and supporting the church's life, work, and mission. It is important for those in positions of leadership to speak the truth in love while also letting your gentleness be known to all.

In all your tasks and responsibilities, our Lord Jesus equips you with the gospel of the forgiveness of sins, the gift that makes you truly competent as a servant of Christ. St. Paul wrote: "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God." The Holy Spirit, who himself has called you to this office, will be with you.

The minister addresses these questions to those being installed:

In keeping with the Word and will of the Lord, I ask you before God and his people:

Do you believe that the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments are the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice? *I* do.

Do you accept the three Ecumenical Creeds—the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian—because they are faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors that they condemn? *I do*.

Do you accept the Unaltered Augsburg Confession along with the other confessions in the Book of Concord: the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, and the Formula of Concord, because they are true expositions of the Word of God and correct presentations of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church?

I do.

Do you solemnly promise that you will strive to perform the duties of your office according to the guidance of our constitution and in conformity with the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions? *I do, and I ask God to help me.*

Will you endeavor to live a life that reflects the love God has for you so that all may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven? *I will, and I ask God to help me.*

The almighty God, who has given you the desire to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

The minister installs each officer individually:

[*Name*], I install you as [*called position*] in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

When all have been installed, the minister says:

May the Lord pour out on you his Holy Spirit for the work committed to you, that you may faithfully proclaim the gospel as you serve God's people.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, we praise you for the gift of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. We thank you that you have kept your promises to be with us always and to provide leaders for your church on earth. Use the gifts and energy of *this/these brother(s)* to proclaim your Word faithfully, to serve others by *their* zeal for your kingdom, and to guide our ministry in the wisdom of the gospel. Safeguard our church in times of trouble from all error and division and by the example of our *brother(s)*, stimulate peace and harmony. Give *them* joy in *their* work among us and bless *their* families during *their* time of service. With *their* guidance and encouragement, produce fruit among us so that the cross of your Son is held up before the world and many hear the word of grace and peace that is ours through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Go, then, and take up the work you have been elected and called to do.

May the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Those installed return to their places.

Remain seated

Blessing

The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you. The Lord look on you with favor and + give you peace.

Amen.

The closing hymn is on the next page.

This hymn concludes the convention's emphasis on cross and crown. While Satan's threats and crosses' burdens are terribly real, "against each foe you'll be victorious"—because of God's promises and power.
