As part of Congregational Services, WELS Discipleship is cradle to casket, womb to tomb faith formation. It encompasses men, women, and children of all ages and every generation. The two key factors of a person's life of discipleship connected to Christ are: 1. high commitment (Luke 9:23) and 2. highly relational (life and faith done in close proximity to Christ and to each other).



The church's role is to encourage and support the homes and lives of their members as parents, grandparents, husbands, and wives.




Women's Ministry connects women across our synod through devotional resources, webinars on relevant topics, and guidance on using their gifts in congregational ministry.

**WELS National Online Teen Bible Study** connects teens across the country spiritually and relationally. Whether teens are on their phones at home or gathering in a teen group at church, this Bible study occurs four times a school year, allowing them to connect with their age group and grow in faith.

**WELS Youth Night** is a series of events gathering 9th-12th-graders from area churches for Bible messages, group discussions, and fellowship.



**Apologetics: Defending the Faith** is a video-based Bible study designed to help church members engage in thoughtful, loving conversations with skeptics of the Christian faith.

**An Honest Conversation** allows WELS teens to explore LGBTQ-related questions in a faith-based environment.

#### Foundation Teen Facilitators Guide Year C - The Second Sunday in Lent **Open Door Policies** One truth shared: Jesus Christ is the only path to heaven for us who cannot save ourselves. No Detours Allowed Starting the Discussion: This first section is intended to be light and easy, to engage and get the conversation going. Have a little fun with these questions. Let's go around the circle: What do you want to be when you grow up? Let's discuss some of the "ups" and "downs" of the answers you gave. Connecting: This section serves as a bridge between the opening conversation and the body of the study/discussion. It should get the group thinking about the topic/text even before they've looked at it. Name some differences between the teen who lives life as a child of God and to the "many (teens who) live as enemies of the cross of Christ"? (v. 18) Digging In: Here we want to dig into some texts or the text for the day and see what Scripture says. The questions are meant to be open ended to begin a spiritual conversation. Let's look again at Philippians 3:17-4:1. Who are some people in your life whose faith you admire and strive to . What are the dangers to someone's spiritual well-being when "their mind is set on earthly things"? . What does Paul mean when he reminds us that "our citizenship is in heaven"? (v. 2) . How can we better "stand firm" in this world that doesn't worship or follow Jesus Christ as Savior? There is no "other way" to get to heaven than Jesus. There are no detours allowed as alternative ways to be saved. Why do we need to always remember this? How can we better share this with others?

### 1 Teen Takeaway.

### 4 key components:

- Starting the Discussion: to engage and get the conversation going. Have a little fun!
- Connecting: a bridge to get teens thinking about the topic/text.
- Digging: see what Scripture says.
  Questions are intentionally openended to make it conversational.
- *Conclusion:* to wrap up the discussion and connect with real life.


**Purpose:** To make members aware of their responsibility to care for missing members.

- and more, culminating in a Welcome Home Sunday celebration.


