If we want our families to produce the fruit of peace, strength, and enduring faith, we must nourish the tree—daily, not just weekly.








We realized telling people to stay rooted wasn't enough. We had to provide the water—simple, accessible ways for them to connect with God's Word daily.







When our resources speak to every season of life, our ministry becomes multigenerational, multi-contextual, and deeply rooted.


























- ➤ Commit as leaders to modeling daily engagement with God's Word and encourage your members to do the same.
